#### STATE OF ALABAMA

The Alabama District remains strong and active. Even Covid-19 cannot slow us down! We have had a most unusual year. Our Alabama Clubs have done exceptional Projects, fundraisers, Share Pilot events, and service and support to their communities, our District and Pilot International.

Membership numbers are down and that is one area we all need to work on, especially when we start meeting again. We ended the year with dues paying: 403 Pilots, 14 Compass Members, and non-dues paying: Eight 50-year members, 38 Emeritus Members, 7 Honorary Pilots, and 2 Student Pilots. That's about 50 less dues paying then last year. Pilot International says we are tied with Texas for highest percentage of growth as of April 1. We want to congratulation the Pilot Luncheon Club of Morgan County for winning the Sally Douglas Award with 10 new members and Barbara Milligan of Pilot Luncheon Club of Morgan County for winning the Maggie Award with 4 new members.

We have a new Compass Club, the Troy University Compass Club chartered in November by the Pilot Club of Troy with 11 Members and a new Anchor Club, Decatur Heritage Christian Academy chartered in August by The Pilot Luncheon Club of Morgan County. The Pilot Club of Jasper have two new Anchor Clubs ready to charter and had planned to do so in April, but due to schools being closed, it's been postponed until probably next Fall. We now have 17 Anchor Clubs with 715 Anchors all over Alabama! Our Anchor Convention held in March at Lake Guntersville State Park was a wonderful event. If vou have never been to an Anchor Convention, put that on your bucket list. It's an experience you will treasure for a life time. The Anchor Club of Guntersville Middle School was our large Anchor Club of the Year, and the Anchor Club of Guntersville High School was our small Anchor Club of the Year! Suzanne Kendra and Janey Sanderson sponsor these two clubs and we want to thank them for all they do for Anchor on the club level and on the District level. I hear so often that Anchors are the future of Pilots, but not if we don't get involved with them and get them involved with Pilot.

We are, again, a 250 District with all 19 Pilot Clubs in Alabama being 250 Clubs. All, but one of our Clubs are Pacesetter Clubs. Our District Project of helping fund two accessible scissor lifts for Camp ASCCA was fully funded. Camp ASCCA had to cancel our Traumatic Brain Injury Camp, but we are already rolling out plans for the 2021 year. We raised \$20,639.75 for TBI Camp with help from Corporate Sponsors, Pilots and Pilot Clubs. Very special thanks to Mellisa King of the Pilot Club of Andalusia for getting all our Corporate Sponsors. Next year she is going to be sharing with us how to get Corporate Sponsors! We will be sponsoring Elizabeth Woodham of Ozark with a Pearl Sparks Scholarship of \$800.00. Congratulations to The Pilot Club of Decatur and the Pilot Luncheon Club for their award-winning entries for Community Service Projects and Brain Related Projects! Pilot Club of Cullman's Peggy Harris won the Jo Vaughn Award for her Leadership over the years to Cullman and the Alabama District. Congratulations to Peggy and thank you for being a Pilot and for all you do for Cullman and the Alabama District.

#### **Greetings, Pilots!**

It has been an honor and a privilege to serve as your Executive Committee Representative this year. It is my pleasure to take this opportunity to update you on our organization.

During our convention last summer, we began our Membership Race, which will conclude on May 15. Remember the club and the District that finishes first in each category and the member who sponsors the most new members will receive a free registration to the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary convention next year in Atlanta. In case of a tie, the first-place winners will be placed in a drawing for the free registration. As of April 1, the District which has added the most members is Texas, with Florida in second place. The Alabama and Texas Districts are tied for the highest percentage growth. There are three clubs tied for most members added, Lake Houston, Odessa, and New Albany (Mississippi). The Lake Houston Club is also in first place for the highest percentage growth. The club and the District with the highest percentage growth as of May 15 will each receive a special recognition on the cover of the Convention program. The clubs and Districts in the top three places in each category will be recognized in the Convention program.

We have added clubs to our organization this year. The three new Pilot Clubs added since July 1 are: Pilot Club of Palm Beach in the Florida District, Walton County Pilot Club, also in the Florida District, and our newest Pilot Club, Takamatsu Pilot Club of the Japan District, which was chartered April 1. We have chartered 7 new Anchor Clubs:

- Decatur Heritage Christian Academy (AL) Chartered August 16, 2019
   Sponsored by the Pilot Luncheon Club of Morgan County
- Walton Middle School Anchor Club (FL) Chartered December 18, 2019
   Sponsored by Walton County Pilot Club
- The Anchor Club of New Albany High School, Indiana (MI-IN) Chartered on January 16, 2020 Sponsored by the Pilot Club of New Albany, Indiana
- The Anchor Club of Vernon High School (LA) Chartered on January 25, 2020 Sponsored by the Leesville Pilot Club
- Lake Weir High School Anchor Club (FL) Chartered on January 31, 2020 Sponsored by the Pilot Club of Ocala
- Chase High School Anchor Club (NC) Chartered on February 4, 2020 Sponsored by the Foothills Pilot Club of North Carolina
- West Forsyth High School Anchor Club (NC) Chartered on February 27, 2020 Sponsored by the Pilot Club of Greensboro

We now have three Compass Clubs. The Compass Club of Covington County was chartered August 7, 2018, The Northwest Florida Compass Club was chartered on June 22, 2019, and the Troy University Compass Club was chartered in Alabama on November 16, 2019. We have also approved intent to charter for the first Compass Club in Texas and hope to be able to announce that chartering very soon.

I am proud to say that we have increased our membership every month since August 2019. Pilot's membership as of April 1 is 6,235, in 310 clubs. Anchor Clubs have 6,620 members, in 206 clubs. There are 18 Compass members, in 3 clubs. The combined total of Pilot International members is 12,873.

An important part of our organization is our philanthropic arm, the Founder's Fund. This year, we have awarded \$52,432.00 in 28 Pilot International Founders Fund matching grants. Through the third quarter of this Pilot year, we have awarded 20 Pick Me Up Grants totaling \$3,729.36. We have also given \$19,995.26 in Safe Harbor Grants. The donations made for our Pilot Club Ambassadors also help fund this grant. This year, \$8,552.00 was donated in honor of our club Ambassadors. As you know, these grants are to help Pilots impacted by disasters. For example, when Hurricane Dorian devastated the Bahamas last year, Pilots from all over the world answered the call to help, donating \$14,033.00 designated for Bahamas Hurricane relief.

We received over 100 scholarship applications this year. Letters announcing the scholarship awards will be going out soon.

Pilot International again took part in the Giving Tuesday campaign. The monies collected were directed to our new helmet grant. This year \$5,461.00 was raised. Speaking of our helmet grants, through the third quarter of this Pilot year we have awarded 25 helmet grants totaling \$3,000.00. So far this year, Pilots have purchased 1,700 helmets.

We hope that you have continued to enjoy the increase in communication from Pilot International. Our Coordinators have provided information every month through the Navigational Notes. Our Headquarters News gives monthly updates on the work of our staff and what is going on at Headquarters in Macon. Emails and social media provide information regarding events such as Pilot First Saturday and the Membership Race. Our Facebook page also shares information from our local clubs and districts. Our Anchor alumni Facebook page has allowed former Anchors to maintain contact with one another.

In just one year, we will be planning our trip to convention in Atlanta, Georgia to begin the celebration of our 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Here are just a few of the special events planned for the convention and the year ahead.

- 1. The 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary history book will be full of wonderful information and pictures from our past and will also contain pictures from the 2021 Convention and celebrations held in October. It will only be available through pre-sales. The book will go on sale during the convention in Atlanta and will not be published until later that year. Books will be shipped to the Governors and available for delivery at District Conventions in 2022.
- 2. In honor of the first service project done by the Pilot Club of Macon which was to help the school district, the service project during the Atlanta Convention will help furnish supplies for the schools in the Macon area. Each District will be assigned to bring specific items from a list provided by the School Superintendent's office. Members flying to Atlanta will be asked to bring smaller items such as pencils or glue sticks. Members who are able to drive will bring larger items such as notebooks and Kleenex.

Each club and district will be asked to *Touch 100 Lives* during the 2021-2022 Pilot Year. The service projects at District Fall Workshops probably already touch 100 lives each year. Brochures with suggestions that will cost little or no money will be provided. Each District has also been asked to have their 2021 Fall Workshop on Saturday, October 16<sup>th</sup>, the date the Pilot International charter was granted. Pictures from each District's service project will be included in the History Book.

On Monday, October  $18^{th}$ , the day of the first Pilot Club meeting of Macon, you are invited come to Macon to celebrate the day our Charter was signed by 40 women who wanted to make a difference in the lives of others. Pictures from this day will be the final pictures in the History Book -100 years of Friendship and Service.

If you have not already reached the \$100, \$500 or \$4,000 level of giving for our 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, please consider making a contribution to help commemorate this special time in Pilot International History.
