



As of January 1<sup>st</sup>, our Alabama District Dues are only \$12.50 per member/annually. It's time for us to double up and get as many new Pilots as possible! We have so many wonderful opportunities coming up to showcase our Alabama District. First, we have Anchor Convention, March 8-9, then it's on to Alabama Traumatic Brain Injury Camp, April 11-13 and finally it's District Convention time, May 24-27, a very important meeting for the Alabama District.

Our District has been so blessed the last 10 years to get Grants. Essentially everything we have contributed has been returned to us in Grants.

**We will begin accepting registrations for TBI Camp February 1, 2025.** We have room for 25 Campers/Caregivers!!! Let's fill up our roster this year!!! Also, it's time for you to send your \$300 Camperships in, even if you don't have a Camper, we have lots of Campers/Caregivers who register that do not have sponsors. And remember we are a 501c3, so any donations by Pilots, Corporations, Businesses, or others is tax deductible. *The Pilot Club of Prattville* is looking for bingo prizes, needed for the adult attendees. If each club would send ten prizes, we would have plenty for our Campers, both men and women, but please be aware, these are adults over the age of 18. *The Pilot Club of Decatur* is looking for crafts for the Campers, and *The Pilot Club of Decatur* is looking items. Let's make this 10<sup>th</sup> camp year wonderful for our Campers/Caregivers and a great experience for all of us.
